Did you know that there are around 1000 residents in our village, the vast majority of whom are adults?

Did you also know that this year the school won't be running a Summer Fair, that Open Gardens has been cancelled, and that the Austrey Festival won't be taking place? So — why is this?

The village relies on a small pool of seemingly tireless volunteers who are extremely generous with their time (and other resources) to organise and run events for the community. Many of these people are involved in multiple events, or help the village in other ways. And it's often the same names cropping up time and time again.



Unfortunately when work, family commitments, or sheer exhaustion, finally overtake these people and they can no longer help out, the events too fall by the wayside. This is a great shame, because the events (like the week-long Arts Festival, and the long gone but fondly remembered Austrey Summer Fair & Carnival Floats) were not only enjoyed by Austrey residents and other local people, but also raised money for charity and community projects.

The old adage "many hands make light work" has never been more apposite.

The sad thing is that the Parish Council holds an unused funding account for big events like the Summer Festival—a sum of money currently standing at £1,690. So if anyone would like to pick up the baton and organise a Super Summer 'Something' in Austrey in 2020, please put a proposal together and contact the Parish Council—clerk@austrey.co.uk—to discuss.

We are of course incredibly grateful to the wonderful volunteers who year, on year, on year, bring us the Austrey Bonfire and Fireworks and organise events such as the Dave Smith memorial Charity Day. There are also other unsung heroes, including the committee members of our various village clubs and societies, and those who mow grass, plant bulbs, organise and run smaller events and community meetings throughout the year.



On a similar, but different, note your Parish Council also needs you to volunteer as there are currently open ositions on the Parish Council.

As a Parish Councillor you will be a voice for your community and be involved in real change. It helps if vou're a "people person" who enjoys

talking to other residents but, more importantly, you need to have the concerns and best interests of the parish as a whole at heart. Councillors are community leaders and represent the aspirations of the public that they serve.

Singing for the Joy of It!

If you love singing when you're on your own but have never thought of joining a choir, here's your chance! The a cappella women's choir based just down the road in Newton Regis has already welcomed a number of Austrey women to its ranks, and they report that it's a great way to socialise, make new friends and enjoy singing for fun.

Studies certainly show consistently that singing is one of the best ways to improve your mental and physical health – it short, it makes you feel good. This is partly because singing releases endorphins, the feel-good chemicals in the brain, but also because it's an aerobic activity and a natural stressreducer. Choir members also tend to get a boost from the social connection and working together to achieve a great sound, as Editor of the Austrey News Emma Fish has found out for herself.

She said, "I joined the choir about three months ago and was a bit apprehensive about the difficulty level I might encounter, but it's turned out to be a fantastic experience. The women are really friendly and the rehearsals of full of laughter – it's really good fun. No one sings on their own and it's all set up so that you can learn the music from special teaching tracks at home. This means everyone has plenty of time to get to grips with their parts and there's further help from the director if you need it. Then when we all get together, we can concentrate on singing and enjoying ourselves!"
